
CONSENT AGENDA

PUBLIC HEARING/APPLICATIONS

2. Consideration of an application to remove four coast live oaks (16", 8", 8", 10") for an addition to a single family residence. The applicant is Harlon Bradley and property owner is Donna Ikeda.

Mike Branson, City Forester, presented the staff report. Chair Refuerzo opened the public hearing at 3:46 p.m. Harlon Bradley and Maria Sutherland appeared before the Commission. There being no other appearances, the public hearing was closed at 3:47 p.m.

Commissioner CARTER moved to approve the application with condition that during construction the tree protection must delineate paths of ingress and egress around the property, seconded by BANG and carried by the following roll call vote:

ORDERS OF BUSINESS

3. Review and discuss the Mayor's request for a Forest and Beach Commission project for Carmel's 100 year anniversary in 2016.

Chair Refuerzo opened the public hearing at 4:01 p.m. Maggie Eaton (expand role of F&B Commission to include the entire environment/eco-system), Sue McCloud and Barbara Livingston (presented ideas that the Centennial Committee had come up with including a new City Christmas tree, and expanding the beach clean-up to another month other than October) appeared before the Commission. There being no other appearances, the public hearing was closed at 4:09 p.m.

The Commission prioritized their ideas:

- 1. 100 trees planted in 100 days culminating with the planting of a significant tree, possibly a new City Christmas tree.
- 2. Re-landscaping of 4 islands on the beach pathway.
- 3. Re-landscaping/beautification of "entry" to City at Ocean Avenue.
- 2. Receive an update on the status of the beach fire project.
 - Project was appealed to the Coastal Commission and the City is waiting on their response and the possibility of a hearing.
 - The smoke monitor has been installed on Scenic and has begun to collect data.
 - The Beach Patrol employees have begun to collect data from beach goers during their beach fire detail.



Chair Refuerzo opened the public hearing at 4:42 p.m. Barbara Livingston, Roberta Miller (clean-up fires north of 10th), Maggie Eaton (presented observations she made during a walk with the security patrol), Sue McCloud (would like the number of people in a part clarified in the data). There being no other appearances, the public hearing was closed at 4:52 p.m.

Commissioner Ferlito would like to know how many citations have been handed out.

5. Review, discuss and make recommendations on the installation of artificial turn near trees.

Mike Branson, City Forester, presented the staff report. Chair Refuerzo opened the public hearing at 5:19 p.m. Barbara Livingston (opposed), Ramie Allard (opposed), Roberta Miller (opposed), Maria Sutherland (opposed), Maggie Eaton and Sue McCloud (in favor) appeared before the Commission. There being no other appearances, the public hearing was closed at 5:37 p.m

Commissioner BANG moved to recommend to Council that #1 – lawns to be avoided and design guidelines should be reinforced; #2 – consider artificial turf as site coverage; #3 – concern for health of trees, use needs further evaluation due to compaction and harm to trees; #4 – possible special consideration to specific areas of the Walker Tract section of City; #5 – encourage other options; and #6 – not enough information, needs more study, seconded by CARTER and carried by the following roll call vote:
